

## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

- Request an application online: <http://studyabroad.arizona.edu/apply>
- On the online registration form, choose **Summer 2010** and **SUM – Germany - Arizona Summer Study in Leipzig**.
- An \$80 application fee will be charged to your Bursar's account once you request an application online and is due within 30 days of posting.
- Upon acceptance, a non-refundable deposit of \$300 will be charged and is due within 30 days of posting.
- By June 1, the remaining program fee is due.
- Attend pre-departure orientation meetings by the Office of Study Abroad and by the Department of German Studies (in late April).

## THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA SUMMER STUDY IN LEIPZIG – GERMANY PROGRAM

A Total-Immersion Summer Study and Travel Program in German  
Language and Culture

**May 28 – June 26, 2010**



The University of Arizona is proud to announce its Summer Study in Leipzig - Germany Program for the seventh time. Students (of any area) with a minimum of two semesters of college German are invited to apply. Application deadline is January 15. Acceptance notices will be sent out by the end of January so that program participants can make travel arrangements early. We will accept a maximum of 30 students. Should there be seats left, we will have a second application deadline on March 15 with notices of acceptance going out by March 30.

## ELIGIBILITY FOR PROGRAM

- Students of the University of Arizona or any other accredited college in the US or Canada, GPA: 2.5 or higher, completion of a minimum of two semesters of College German or equivalent

## COURSES OFFERED

(As Summer One Session)

- GER 211: Intermediate Intensive German (6 units): Intensive practice of communication skills in German (listening, reading, speaking, writing), systematic review of German grammar (equivalent to GER 201 and GER 202). Prerequisite: completion of two semesters of German study at college level or the equivalent.
- GER 392: Directed Research in German Studies (6 units): Daily class meetings, conversation, reading and writing, individual and group projects on topics in German Studies (art, business, film, history, linguistics, music, politics, sports). Prerequisite: completion of a minimum of four semesters of German study at college level or the equivalent.
- GER 492: Directed Research in German Studies (6 units): Same as GER 392, but includes a more extensive individual research project on a topic in German literature/culture. Prerequisite: GER 392 of a previous Summer Study in Leipzig Program.

## ACCOMODATION

Single rooms or apartments in student residence halls (with German and international students) equipped with Internet connection (via Ethernet).

## THE CITY

Leipzig is located in the central eastern part of Germany in the Free-State of Saxony. It has a population of 493,000. The University of Leipzig, one of Germany's pre-eminent seats of learning, was founded in 1409. Famous students include Leibniz, Lessing, Klopstock, and Goethe. You are invited to become part of the community of 24,000 German and 2000 international students during this summer program of study and travel.

Johann S. Bach, Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, and Robert Schumann are three great names closely associated with Leipzig as a city of music. Bach lived and worked in Leipzig as musical director and cantor. The *Gewandhaus Orchestra* became world famous under Mendelssohn-Bartholdy. The *Leipzig Opera* is the oldest in Germany. Leipzig has also been an important city of trade, books and publishing. The church *Nikolaikirche* was the starting point and focal point of the Monday demonstrations that were the catalysts for the peaceful revolution and reunification of Germany.

More than a decade after Germany's re-unification, Leipzig has become again a major center of higher education, research, culture, nightlife and shopping as well as a busy venue for trade fairs and conferences. The lovely old Renaissance and Baroque buildings, restaurants and cafes, numerous museums and art galleries are now fully restored, providing a stylish paradise for students, shoppers and sightseers. High-class entertainment is assured – attractions for arts-lovers include the *Gewandhaus* concert hall, the *Opera House*, the *St. Thomas Choir*, cabarets, theaters, jazz cellars, the *Drallewatsch* pub district and the *Moritzbastei*, Europe's biggest students' club (an underground vault with various bars, cafes, and dance floors).

## EXCURSIONS

There will be a weekend excursion, two day-trips to other cities in the area, a visit of either the Porsche or BMW factory, a brewery tour (Brauhaus Reudnitz), various visits of museums, and a concert in the Opernhaus or the Gewandhaus. Participants will have two weekends for rest or individual travel.

## TRANSPORTATION

Students make their own travel arrangements from the US to Leipzig. Leipzig is easily accessible by air to the airport Leipzig/Halle or through high-speed trains from Frankfurt (3 hrs), or Berlin (1-2 hrs).

## ESTIMATED PROGRAM FEE

**\$ 2,350**

The fee includes:

- A \$600 fee charged by the Office of Study Abroad (covering University of Arizona tuition and registration fees for 6 academic units and program administrative costs)
- Single room accommodation in student residence halls
- Unlimited transportation cost within Leipzig
- Excursions (travel by train or bus, accommodation in budget hotels)
- Group events including guided city tours, entrance fees to museums, a concert, and a farewell party

Expenses not included in the program fee: transportation to Germany, meals, medical/accident insurance and miscellaneous personal expenses

## INSURANCE

Every student is required to have international medical insurance and must show proof that s/he has a policy valid for the duration of the program. The university also recommends that students purchase a policy covering travel accidents.
