## RUTH & ESTHER

## RUTH

SET: In the time of the Judges (ca. 1200-1000 BCE)

WRITTEN: In the 5<sup>th</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> Century

THEMES: Defined by CONTEXT

IF the book had been written during the Davidic era, would have established David's legitimacy.

BUT IF it is post-exilic, it responds to the tension between exclusive vs. inclusive ideas of Judaism: Ezra-Nehemiah vs. 2<sup>nd</sup> Isaiah and Jonah.

What is required to be a member of the community?

LOYALTY: To the Torah

To the Community

NOT Playing by the rules or worshiping in a certain way.

LOYALTY as CHESED

Faithfulness – Kindness – Tenderness Warm-heartedness – Compassion – Honesty

## **ESTHER**

SET: During the Persian Diaspora (after 450BCE)

WRITTEN: In the 2<sup>nd</sup> Century (probably), during the persecutions of Antiochus IV Epiphanes.

THEMES: Defined by CONTEXT – Macabean Judaism: NEW UNDERSTANDING of **How to Survive**.

The old, un-heroic model: absolute dependence & trust. Abraham & Moses.

The new, heroic model: self-confidence inspired by faith. David confronting Goliath.

Thus Esther challenging Ahasuerus.

Complicated by exemplifying that heroism in a woman.
